



Eligibility for Admission to 1st Year

A student who has cleared the Senior Secondary (10+2) Examination (Academic Stream) conducted by the H.P. Board of School Education (Or in case of Shastri, passed Prak Shastri from Sanskrit College affiliated to the HPU/SPU) or an examination accepted as equivalent thereto by the various bodies of the H.P. University will be given admission strictly according to merit and reservation roster for various reserved categories of students as per the H.P. University Guidelines.

- (i) Provided that the candidate who has passed the qualifying examination, i.e., 10+2 with Science Stream shall be given admission to B.Sc.
- (ii) Provided that the candidate who has passed the qualifying examination, i.e. 10+2 with Commerce stream shall be given preference to admission to B.Com.
- (iii) Students with Economics or Mathematics at 10+2 level are also eligible for admission to B.Com.
- (iv) Any student with a compartment in 10+2 examination will not be eligible for admission.
- (v) An applicant must not be more than 23 years of age in the case of boys and 25 years in the case of girls on 01-07-2025. There is a relaxation of 3 years for SC/ST candidates as per university norms. The Vice-Chancellor may permit age relaxation up to a maximum of 6 months for reasons to be recorded in writing.
- (vi) One seat in each department shall be reserved for a single girl child which will be allotted on the basis of merit.
- (vii) In each main core course of study there are 80 seats available.
- (viii) **Regarding NEP**, guidelines will be issued as soon as the institute is intimated by the concerned universities.

2. CHECKLIST OF DOCUMENTS REQUIRED AT THE TIME OF FILLING OUT ADMISSION FORMS

The **scanned copies** of the following documents are required at the time of filling **online Admission Forms** for 1st year:

- Passport Size Photograph.
- Self-Attested Copies of Matriculation and 10+2 Certificates.
- Latest Character Certificate from the institution last attended. In the case of private candidates, latest character certificate by some H.P. Govt. Gazetted Class-I Officer or any other competent authority.
- Self-Attested Copies of category certificate (SC/ST/OBC/IRDP/EWS/PWD) if claimed.
- Self-Attested Copies of Sports/Cultural/NCC/NSS etc. if any (At 10+2 level)
- A certificate from a competent authority in case of a single girl child.
- Himachali Bonafide certificate for fee concession (for girl students only).
- Copy of Aadhar card.

3. GENERAL GUIDELINES FOR ADMISSION TO BACHELOR'S DEGREE

1. Admission to various classes will be made on the recommendation of the admission committee constituted for the purpose.
2. Any gap of one year or more in the academic career of an applicant before seeking admission to the Bachelor's Degree must be supported by documentary evidence or he or she has to give an undertaking as proof of his or her activities during the period of gap.
3. All the original certificates must be produced by an applicant at the time of verification.
4. Candidates coming from a Board/University other than H.P. Board of School Education or H.P. University must provide an original Migration Certificate at the time of filling up the University Registration Form.
5. Physically Disabled Applicants seeking fee concession must furnish their status certificate from the Medical Board.
6. National Open School students seeking admission to the 1st year of a Bachelor's Degree must have cleared all five papers including English.

7. Admission of a candidate is liable to be cancelled in case he or she furnishes incomplete/false information or in case of concealment of facts. Disciplinary action will also be taken against such candidates.
8. Admission cannot be claimed as a matter of right. The Principal can deny admission to any such student whose conduct is detrimental to the interest/discipline of the institution.
9. Initially all admissions shall be provisional / and subject to the final approval by SPU.
10. Rules of admission are subject to change as per the SPU notification issued from time to time.

4. OUTLINE OF THE COURSES OFFERED UNDER THE CHOICE-BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (CBCS) FOR U.G. CLASSES

- 1. Core Course:** A course offered by a Discipline/Subject which is to be compulsorily studied by the candidate.
 - a. Discipline Specific Core Course (DSC) of Six Credits: A core course offered by the Discipline or Subject chosen by the candidate as the main or other Discipline/Subject. These courses aim to cover the basics that a student is expected to imbibe in a specific discipline.
 - b. Two papers each in English and Hindi in B. A. and B.Com. of Six Credits.

- 2. Elective Course:** A course which a student can choose from a pool of courses offered by a Discipline/Subject.
 - a. Discipline Specific Elective Course (DSE) of Six Credits: An elective course is a course which is chosen by a student from the courses offered by the Discipline/Subject of her or his choice. These courses are advanced courses which provide an extended scope.
 - b. Generic Elective course (GE) of Six Credits: A course chosen from Discipline/Subjects other than DSC-1 and DSC-2. They are interdisciplinary and provide exposure to students of other disciplines and broaden the scope of learning.

- 3. Ability Enhancement Course**
 - a. Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course (AECC) of Four Credits: These courses include Environmental Science and English/Hindi/Sanskrit.

- b. Ability Enhancement Elective Course (AEEC) or Skill Enhancement Course (SEC) of Four Credits: A course which a student studies in DSC-1 (Main Subject). They are value-based courses that aim to provide hands-on training to hone the skills and competencies.

5. CHOOSING A PROGRAMME/STUDY COURSE

A candidate seeking admission to any programme from Arts, Science, or Commerce stream is required to choose one of the Disciplines listed below as DSC-1(main subject). Thereafter he/she will choose the other subject from the list of combinations given in the table below:

Evaluation Process

Students are assessed through an evaluation system comprising of Comprehensive Continuous Assessment (CCA) and End-Term Examination (ETE).

Comprehensive Continuous Assessment (CCA): 30 marks

Mid-Term Test: 10 marks, Class Test: 5 marks, Assignment / Seminar / Presentation: 10 marks and Attendance: 5 marks

End-Term Examination (ETE): 70 Marks

For practical subjects, ETE will be split up into ETE Practical (20 marks) and ETE Theory (50 marks).

Class Room Attendance: Each student will have to attend a minimum 75% of lectures/tutorials/practicals. A student having less than 75% attendance will not be allowed to appear in the Term End Examination.

Students having attendance between 74% and 65% will have to apply for exemption in a prescribed form accompanied by clear reason(s) for absence to the authorized functionaries. Those having attendance between 64% and 50% will have to apply for exemption in a prescribed form accompanied by a Medical Certificate.

Completion of Degree

A regular candidate shall have to undergo the prescribed courses of study in the college affiliated to Himachal Pradesh University for a period not less than three and not more than five academic years from the date of admission. For completion of an undergraduate degree, the student shall have to accumulate a minimum of 132 successful credit hours of coursework. Successful Passing of a course includes Classroom learning, Assignment work, Mid-term test and Annual Examinations.

Note: The admission to B.A. 1st, B.Sc. 1st and B.Com. 1st year will take place according to the latest directions from the government. The information regarding the same will be displayed on the college notice board and college website, and it will also be disseminated through Print/Electronic Media.

1. Exemption of Tuition fee will be available to the Girls from Himachal Pradesh only subject to the production of Bonafide Himachali Certificate.
2. Disabled Students with more than 40% disability will be exempted from fee subject to the production of disability certificate by the competent medical authority.
3. Fees and Funds once deposited are not refundable in any case.
4. Every student must pay the dues on the dates notified from time to time
5. Registration fee will not be charged from a student who migrates from some other college if he/she is already registered with S.P. U. Other dues will have to be paid for the whole session.

8. GENERAL INFORMATION

Scholarships and Concessions

The students are informed from time to time about various Post Matric Centre and State Sponsored Scholarship Schemes and the dates for applying for them. Some of the schemes are mentioned below.

The students have to apply online through **National Scholarship Portal NSP 2.0** (<https://scholarships.gov.in/>) and submit copies of downloaded forms along with copies of the required documents for verification to the teacher in charge of the scholarships. The scholarships are awarded to eligible students as per the norms and rules prescribed by the government and are disbursed online. Therefore, it is mandatory for a student to have her/his bank account linked to her/his Aadhar number.

If two male wards of the same parent are getting education in the college, only one will be eligible for the scholarship/ fee concession.

Leave Rules for Students and Fine

1. A student can proceed on leave with the prior permission of the Principal/Class Teacher. The application should also be signed by the parent of the student and duly recommended by the tutor.
2. A tutor can recommend leave up to a maximum of seven days and leave for a longer duration will be sanctioned by the Principal.
3. Leave on account of illness if it is for more than three days must be accompanied by a medical certificate.
4. Students participating in various inter-college games or other competitions including youth festival tours etc. will have to get their leave sanctioned by the Principal with prior recommendation of their incharges concerned before their departure.
5. Failure to pay dues on/by the due date will entail a fine of Rs. 10 per day.
6. If a student remains absent without sanctioned leave for ten days or more, his / her name shall be struck off from the College Roll.
7. Once name is struck off the students must readmit himself/herself within seven

days. After that he/she will have to pay a fine of rupee 10 per day at the time of readmission.

8. A student can take readmission with a fine of Rs. 100/- for the first time and Rs. 200/- for the 2nd time on the recommendation of the concerned teacher and in the presence of his/her parents/guardians. The students will not be considered for readmission, third time.

Other fines:

- Absence fine per period: Rs. 1/-
- Absence from practical: Rs. 3/-
- Absence from Mid-Term Test: Rs. 50/- per paper.
- Late return of Library books: Rs. 1/- per day after 7 days.

9. The Principal can expel/rusticate a student from the college if found guilty of misconduct.

College Library

The College Library plays a crucial role in teaching and learning activities. GDC Banjar has an integrated Library Information Management System (LMS) which maintains library records and bar-coded cataloguing etc. The college library has digital cataloging of books that are barcoded. The students are issued bar-coded library cards. The college has a subscription to N-LIST (National Library and Information Services Infrastructure for Scholarly Content), being jointly executed by the UGC-INFONET Digital Library Consortium, INFLIBNET Centre and the INDEST-AICTE Consortium, IIT Delhi. This project provides free access to around thirty lakhs full-text e-books and more than six thousand e-journals on all subjects to students, researchers and faculty members. Full-text e-books can also be downloaded or printed directly from the publishers' website under this project. A computer section for students has been established in the library where they can access various e-resources. The library has around 9000 books having a collection of both text and reference books. Latest subject books, magazines and newspapers have been subscribed for the library. There is always an effort to purchase the latest editions of books to update the knowledge of students in various subjects. The library at present subscribes

to magazines, journals and newspapers. The facilities of computer and printing machines are also available to the students. For current affairs and competitive preparations, a separate section has also been created. The library has a subscription to both Hindi and English Newspapers.

The books are issued to the students as per the following rules.

- ✓ Only a regular College student will be allowed to get books issued from the College Library on the production of an Identity cum-Library Card.
- ✓ Ordinarily two books are issued at a time for 7 days and the librarian has the right to recall the books at any time.
- ✓ Reference Books, Journals and Magazines are not issued. However, the students can consult the same in the library.
- ✓ In case of loss of the book, the student will have to either replace the book or pay a fine in addition to the present price of the book.
- ✓ The security deposit will lapse if a student does not apply for refund of security within one year of his/her leaving the college.

College Library/Identity Card

Each admitted student is issued a college Library/Identity card which has her/his complete personal information along with one stamp-size photograph. In case of loss of the card, a duplicate identity card will be issued on payment of Rs 20/- and production of a copy of the FIR lodged with the police station.

College Magazine

The College has been publishing its magazine *Seraj Shikha* since the session 2013-2014 to allow the students to showcase their talent and hone their creative writing skills. Interested students can contribute their write-ups for the college magazine by contacting the editors of the magazine.

Sports and Co-curricular Activities

The college provides facilities to the students who wish to make a mark in games. The college prepares teams for University Championships in Athletics, Basketball, Cricket,

Volleyball, Table tennis, Badminton and Kabaddi. The college provides various incentives for the students participating in competitions held at University/ State/ Zonal/ National level. A committee of teachers decides the formation of teams to represent the college in different tournaments. The college also provides guidance to students for participation in various competitions held during the HPU Youth Festivals. These items are Music (vocal & instrumental), Debates, Declamation, Quiz, Poetic Symposium, Painting, Dance, Poster Making, Rangoli, Collage, etc.



N.S.S.

NSS is a very important part of the activities of any educational institute. It helps in developing the spirit of 'service to the community'. The college has one unit of NSS volunteers. The unit has a total of 120 students in it. The volunteers have been actively engaged in campus beautification and cleanliness and other services to the community.



N.C.C.

The college has a platoon of 26 cadets with 18 Boys and 8 Girls. The interested candidate can seek more information from the NCC Incharge of the college.



Rovers and Rangers

The Bharat Scout and Guides is a voluntary organization. It is devoted to the development of the character of the young generation and the selfless service to the country. The enrolment was 32 including 24 Rangers and 08 Rovers for the session 2023-24. In this session, new students will be enrolled as Rovers and Rangers.



Career Counselling & Placement Cell

The College has established a Career Guidance and Counselling Cell for guiding the students in pursuing the career most suitable considering their abilities. This Cell also helps the students in developing their personalities and sharpening their communication skills. An Interactive Panel has been provided by the Directorate of Higher Education to disseminate information regarding various career choices to the students.



Annual Prize Distribution Function

The annual prize distribution function is held every year in the month of March/April to award students who have shown excellence in the fields of Academics, Sports, Cultural, NSS and other activities. The rules for the awards of prizes will be notified later on.



Tutorial Groups

Tutorial groups are formed every year in the college to ensure closer interaction between teachers and students. These groups provide an opportunity for the students to exhibit their creative potential, which otherwise remains dormant, and share their problems and difficulties with their Tutor. There are around 60 to 70 students in a group. Each tutorial group is guided by a member of the faculty and students can seek advice regarding any matter from their tutorial head. The tutors also act as mentors.

Community Participation / PTA

There is a Parent Teacher Association which plans and undertakes development work in the College. The association is run by the Executive Committee which makes all decisions. The students and teachers contribute money to the PTA fund at the time of admission. The objectives are:

- (a) To incorporate suggestions from the various members of the Association for the improvement of the educational standard of the college.
- (b) To seek the participation of the parents in the development activities of the institution.

College Student Central Association (CSCA)

To inculcate leadership qualities among the students and to provide a platform to address the students' problems, the CSCA is constituted in the college in accordance with the university notification. At present, the CSCA is a nominated body of the students comprising the President, Vice President, General Secretary, and Joint Secretary as well as class and other nominated representatives.



Old Students Association (OSA)

Govt. Degree College Banjar Old Students' Association was registered in 2019 under the H.P. Society Regulation Act 2006. The association aims to establish a link with the old students of the college for contributing to the enrichment of student's knowledge and upliftment of the college.

Disaster Management Club

The college has established Disaster Management Club with a vision to prepare a group of volunteers who can reach out to the tragedy/natural calamity-affected people at the earliest so as to provide them with immediate relief in tandem with NGOs and local administration.

A fully furnished language lab has been established with 16 computers during the session 2021-2022. The lab has a software in English language to train the students in communication skills.



Canteen

The college canteen offers a variety of food items prepared in a neat and clean and homely atmosphere.

Educational / Study Tours

Educational / study tours are organized so that the students do not remain within the confines of their curriculum and can extend outside the boundaries of the classroom and academics. The students who are regular in their attendance and have good conduct are eligible for the Educational Tour. Students will have to produce written permission from their parents for joining such tours. No tour can be organized without an accompanying teacher and prior permission from the college administration. An accompanying female teacher is mandatory in case of girl students going for an educational tour/ tournament/ youth festival.



Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU)

IGNOU has established its study centre in the College. The centre offers a range of courses, Diploma, and Certificate Programmes for students. The students can choose subjects of their choice and explore their potential. The study centre of GC Banjar got “Best Study Centre Award-2023 (Most Vibrant Centre)” for the session 2023-2024.



Conduct and Discipline

1. Ragging is strictly banned in the college. There shall be no ragging in and around the college.
2. Following nefarious activities will be considered gross misconduct and can lead to fines or suspension/ expulsion.
 - a. Writing obscenities / dirty words on black boards, walls or furniture.
 - b. Aimlessly loitering in the corridors, making noise or attempting to disturb classes.
 - c. Smoking or taking Drugs/Alcohol, etc. on campus.
 - d. Any attempt to damage the furniture or other property of the campus.
 - e. Pasting posters on the walls or notices on the Notice Board without the Principal's permission.
 - f. Misbehaving with the college staff.
 - g. Using mobile phones in classrooms and playing music on the cell phones on campus.
 - h. Bringing outsiders, miscreants or anti-social elements to the campus.
3. Students who participate in sports or other extracurricular activities / educational tours must produce written permission from their parents/guardians.
4. Every student must carry his/her identity card which is issued to him/her when

he/she joins the college. He/she must produce the identity card whenever demanded.

5. Parents / Guardians are requested to remain in touch with the college Principal and the concerned teachers regarding the progress of their wards in the college.

Anti-Smoking /Anti-Tobacco

Smoking and use of tobacco products are strictly prohibited in the college campus. Anyone found smoking or using tobacco products will have to pay a fine of Rs. 500/- in addition to suspension or expulsion from the college.

10. ANTI- RAGGING AND ZERO TOLERANCE TO RAGGING

Ragging according to Supreme Court of India Judgement /order 2001 is defined as “any disorderly conduct whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness to any student, indulging in rowdy or indiscipline activities which cause or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in a fresher or a junior student or asking the students to do any act or perform something which such students will not do in the ordinary course and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of a fresher or a junior student.”

Strict action will be taken against those found guilty of ragging and/or abetting Ragging. Depending upon the nature and gravity of the offence the possible punishment for those found guilty of ragging shall be any one or any combination of the following:

1. Withholding scholarship or other benefit.
2. Debarring from representation of college events.
3. Withholding of results.
4. Suspension or expulsion from the hostel, mess and college.
5. Legal proceedings under criminal law shall be initiated.
6. Fine upto Rs. 25000/- with a public apology.
7. In case of more serious allegations, FIR will be lodged with the police and the matter will be disposed of in a court of law where if convicted for such an offence the offender can be punished and will not be eligible for admission in any other institute for a period of three years.
